Dear Secretary-General, Dear High Representatives Sampaio and Al-Nasser, Members of the Group of Friends, Dear Colleagues, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Let me first of all express my deep appreciation to HE President Jorge Sampaio when completing his six year's tenure as High Representative of the UN Alliance of Civilizations.

We highly appreciate and acknowledge your commitment and tireless efforts in leading the Alliance through today's challenging times. Under your exemplary leadership, the Alliance of Civilizations has indeed become a well recognized global platform for intercultural dialogue and cooperation, devoted to promoting trust, tolerance and respect among human beings of different beliefs, cultures and languages.

We congratulate HE Mr. Nassir Abdulaziz Al-Nasser, former President of the General Assembly, for his appointment as the new High Representative and wish him further success when carrying on the outcomes-oriented conflict prevention work of his predecessor.

We have to express our gratitude to our hosts, the Government of Austria for organizing the 5th Global Forum of the Alliance. At a time of global changes when our world is more interdependent than ever, it is indeed of outmost importance that actors become further aware of their shared responsibility when promoting religious freedom, media pluralism and a positive narrative for migration. When concluding, dear High Representative, let me reiterate Hungary's full commitment to and appreciation of the goals and results of the Alliance of Civilizations, a precious tool in our hands for the benefit of the one and only human civilization.
